Governor Pritzker Proclaims June as Myasthenia Gravis Awareness Month

Illinois Gov. JB Pritzker has officially proclaimed June 2025 as Myasthenia Gravis Awareness Month, recognizing the impact of this rare autoimmune neuromuscular disorder that affects approximately 20 in every 100,000 individuals.

Myasthenia Gravis (MG) disrupts the communication between nerves and muscles, resulting in symptoms such as muscle weakness, difficulty chewing, swallowing, and breathing, and profound fatigue. Due to its rarity and complex presentation, MG often goes undiagnosed or misdiagnosed.

The proclamation highlights our work at Conquer MG, which aims to support those affected by MG through patient services, education, advocacy, and research initiatives.

Gov. Pritzker's declaration calls on all Illinois residents to raise awareness and support efforts to improve diagnosis, treatment, and the search for a cure for this currently incurable disease.

Done at the Capitol in the City of Springfield the 12th day of May in the year 2025, and of the State of Illinois the two hundred and sixth.

Black patients were also slightly less likely to receive steroid treatment compared to white patients. However, no major differences were found in access to neurologists or in diagnostic testing rates by race or ethnicity—an encouraging contrast to disparities seen in other neurologic conditions.

Disparities in Myasthenia Gravis Care — Differences in Testing and Treatment Emerge

A recent article by Paul Smyth, MD, for MedPage Today highlights that while early diagnosis and treatment are critical for managing Myasthenia Gravis (MG), a recent study shows that treatment approaches can vary depending on a patient's sex or race.

Researchers analyzing data from 4,900 privately insured patients found that women were less likely than men to receive key treatments, including steroids, steroid-sparing agents, and advanced therapies like IVIG or plasmapheresis. This was notable even though women tend to have earlier onset and more severe forms of MG.

study) found that people of color reported longer diagnostic journeys, saw more healthcare providers before diagnosis, and described the process as more stressful compared to white patients.

While the data suggests progress in certain areas, it also highlights the importance of continued education, earlier recognition of symptoms, and more consistent application of treatment guidelines.

Researchers and patients alike are calling for improved provider awareness, better record-sharing systems, and broader efforts to ensure equitable MG care for all.


